

The **South African Environmental Observation Network (SAEON)** is a research platform funded by the Department of Science and Technology (DST) and managed by the National Research Foundation (NRF). SAEON is mandated to establish and manage long-term environmental observatories; maintain reliable long-term environmental data sets; promote access to data for research and/or informed decision making; and contribute to capacity building. The mandate is executed through six geographically distributed nodes that are coordinated by the SAEON National Office in Pretoria.

## Key responsibilities will include:

- Develop, design and implement research and monitoring projects to further the understanding of the drivers of global change and their impacts on the Fynbos environment
- The development of research relationships with Higher Education Institutions and Research Institutes that will support SAEON's research and monitoring objectives
- Recruitment of post-graduate students and supervision of their research in order to build research capacity in global change science
- Conduct reviews of research relevant to understanding global change in Fynbos
- Publication of peer reviewed research papers
- Provide input based on evidence for mitigation or adaptation to global change at management and policy level
- Ensure effective planning, administration, reporting and financial management of all
  activities

## Requirements

- The minimum qualification required is a completed PhD in ecology, biology or environmental sciences
- Two or more years post-PhD research experience
- A record of peer-reviewed publications
- Experience of collaboration with scientists and students
- Ability to communicate effectively in oral and written English
- A valid driver's licence
