

## **South African National Biodiversity Institute Six-month Science Internships in Cape Town and Durban**

SANBI is offering a number of internship positions to contribute towards ongoing research projects. Applicants should be science students interested in gaining practical experience in research. Enthusiastic students with BSc, BSc Hons and MSc degrees are urged to apply. No prior working experience is required but good grades at university and a keen interest in biological sciences and the environment will be a distinct advantage.

We invite applications from South African students and preference will be given to students from previously disadvantaged backgrounds. Interns will be appointed for six months from 1 October 2011 – 31 March 2012.

## Durban:

Applicants must be prepared to do field work.

A skills development programme will run alongside the research experience.

The monthly stipend offered is fixed at R4,500. No other benefits apply as these are contract positions.
