- Aid with analyses of mark-recapture records to establish adult survival and juvenile recruitment.
- Help design rigorous field methods to assess crane abundance and occupancy.
- Assist with multivariate analyses to examine environment and demographic relationships of threatened species.
- Aid interrogation of the cranes database as required for the publication of peer reviewed journal articles.
