

Regional Conservation Manager: Mpumalanga and Free State BirdLife South Africa's Important Bird and Biodiversity Areas Programme

The preferred candidate will:

- have completed an appropriate university degree, or equivalent, in natural sciences or natural resource management.
- have a working knowledge of the conservation issues and threatened bird species occurring in the Grassland Biome.
- have a working knowledge of grassland ecology.
- have exemplary administrative abilities and organisational skills.
- have knowledge of and experience in using the range of Microsoft Office software.
- be fluent in written and spoken Afrikaans and English.

In addition, the ideal candidate will

- be self-motivated, hardworking, willing to travel when required and able to work independently with minimum supervision
- · have good writing and communication skills
- have administrative and financial management experience and inter-personal skills at all levels
- have a valid code B motor vehicle driving licence.

The successful candidate will report to the Important Bird and Biodiversity Areas Programme Manager at BirdLife South Africa.

The position will be based at a place to be determined in either Mpumalanga or the Free State.

BLSA offers a salary which is commensurate with the position and responsibilities.
