



VU UNIVERSITY AMSTERDAM-NRF DESMOND TUTU DOCTORAL PROGRAMME GUIDELINES

1. <u>Required Qualifications:</u>

Individuals with a research Master's degree or in the process of completing requirements for such a degree may apply. However, successful completion of a Master's degree is a pre-requisite for admission onto the Programme. Note that for doctoral studies the applicants must have:

 A Master's degree in the appropriate disciplines as specified in the "Desmond Tutu Doctoral Programme Fourteen PhD Positions: Phase One Call" documents available online at <u>https://nrfsubmission.nrf.ac.za/</u>

Candidates must have demonstrable communication and writing skills in the English language.

2. Funding:

NRF - VU University Amsterdam Desmond Tutu Doctoral Programme will cover overall costs related to scholarships and programme management both in South Africa and the Netherlands, it will provide to selected PhD students a scholarship of **R220 000** approximately (depending on exchange rates), each year toward doctoral study costs and will approximately cover:

- Two economy return flights from South Africa to Amsterdam per year;
- Required visa and residence permit costs;
- Accommodation and living allowance in Amsterdam (for two one-month visits each year);
- Course fees at VU University Amsterdam;

In addition to the stated amount the doctoral dissertation defense will be covered in the final year, and the project management, supervisor travelling costs will be covered by the NRF – VU University Amsterdam Desmond Tutu Doctoral Programme each year.

3. <u>Citizenship and residency status:</u>

Applicants must be South African citizens or permanent residents.

4. <u>Commencement of studies:</u>

Successful applicants in this cycle may commence with their doctoral studies any time from **02 January 2015** or within the VU Amsterdam 2015/2016 academic year.

5. <u>Dependants:</u>

The NRF and VU Amsterdam are not responsible for dependants accompanying a scholarship holder to Amsterdam.

6. <u>Application forms</u>:

7. <u>Closing date for applications</u>:

The closing date for applications and all required documents (applications, copies of transcripts and certificates, and reference letters) is **Friday**, **29 August 2014**.

No requests for extension will be considered.

8. <u>Selection procedures</u>:

All applications will be reviewed by a selection committee and short-listed candidates will be invited for telephonic interviews or face-to-face interviews in Gauteng. Where applicable, the NRF will arrange and cover travel costs for short-listed candidates.

9. Format of application and required documentation:

Completed typed applications must include the following documents:

- Application form;
- Certified copy of South African Identity Document;
- Certified copy of academic transcripts ;
- Certified copies of all degree certificate; and
- Two letters of reference.

NB: The two letters of reference must be forwarded directly to the NRF, under separate cover, by Friday **29 August 2014**, to Ms Nosisa Dube at <u>nosisa.dube@nrf.ac.za</u>; cc: Ms Sindi Kayi at <u>sindi.kayi@nrf.ac.za</u>. **Incomplete applications will not be considered.**
