

Skills Development Programme: Project Coordinator Vacancy

Purpose of the Position: The Endangered Wildlife Trust (EWT) is one of the largest biodiversity conservation NGOs in southern Africa. The primary responsibilities of this position will be to coordinate and support the training projects implemented through the EWT's Skills Development Programme (EWT-SDP). More specifically, these responsibilities will focus on the EWT's Wildlife Crime Training Project and include (1) The development of training materials, resources and assessment tools for specific training programmes; (2) Plan for and implement training interventions including coordination of applicable logistics; (3) Develop training presentations and lectures and deliver actual training; (4) Monitor and evaluate quality of training interventions and workshops (including workplace based impacts/ gaps); (5) Work closely with project team members including project stakeholders, and consultants; and (6) Project administration in accordance with EWT's policies and procedures.

- A LLB or Environmental Sciences degree, or at least 10 years demonstrable experience in conservation-related training and/or law enforcement activities;

- Excellent communication and time management skills;
- Ability to communicate with multiple partners and network effectively;

- Willingness to travel regularly and work outside office hours when necessary.
